Search the web and raise money for your favourite charity with Everyclick.com

VAB has started using a great new search engine that raises money for charity, every time we search the web. Everyclick works just like any other search engine, but allows the users to choose the charity they would like to benefit from their searching; you can support any one of 170,000 UK charities ranging from the largest, such as Save the Children, to small local charities including schools and churches. Any registered UK charity can benefit, the amount each charity receives is dependant upon how many people choose to support them.

The revenue generated for charities comes from companies that advertise on the site; everyclick gives 50% of its revenue to charity every month. There is no sign up fee or hidden charge to the user or the charity. If only 10% the UK online population used Everyclick.com for their searches, an additional £172,000 would be raised for charity every day!

Local News

Community Discount Club UK: 'Helping community groups do more with their money'

A scheme to address the inequalities that poverty and poor access to resources have on people and communities across the UK is being set up. The Community Discount Club will work on behalf of its members, to gain discounts on products and services from businesses and other establishments. Community Discount Club will initially focus on providing access to discounted food and other non grocery items through a partnership with Company Shop Limited. Company Shop Limited currently provide a service to the UK's food, drink and non-grocery manufacturing industries by purchasing irregular and residual product. The Company Shop distributes product through a secure and strict network of some 350 staff shops; all are located within manufacturing premises and operate on a membership only basis which is not open to the public

The 'Community Discount Club' model is being tested over 6 months. **The club is looking to recruit organisations to take part in two pilots.** They are looking for:

1. Organisations that regularly purchase large quantities of food and groceries to test a telephone order and deliver to organisations site/s
2. Organisations in Yorkshire to use the Company Shop outlet in Barnsley

The average potential savings for an organisation are estimated at 73%, and shopping regularly through the scheme could give even bigger benefits. Living/Work Spaces at DarleyArts

DarleyArts is based at Darley Grove, in Worsbrough Dale; a village situated between the M1 junction 36 (Birdwell) and Barnsley. Public services to Barnsley, Sheffield and Leeds are good. DarleyArts provides **start up arts/media accommodation** for up to 14 young single adults who have a focus on the creative industries. Some residents are students; others are starting out on their careers. Some rent a space and travel to the site.

Individual rooms are let furnished. There are extensive communal facilities including two common rooms, kitchens, payphone, gardens and car parking on site. In addition there is a music rehearsal room, wood/metalwork space and an office with hot desk and IT facilities. All rooms are connected to a shared broadband service. We also have access to sound recording and TV studios.

The cost: £60pw inclusive of all bills (including broadband), the use of communal living spaces and support services which are provided by a Social Enterprise company 'DarleyArts Support Services Ltd'. This is payable in a number of ways depending on circumstances. No deposit is required; however, references or a guarantor may be needed.

The Big Green Challenge

The Big Green Challenge from NESTA – the National Endowment for Science, Technology and the Arts (www.nesta.org.uk/) is a unique competition with a £1 million prize fund. It is designed to encourage and reward people working together. The competition is one of several experimental, high-impact projects developed by the Innovation Challenges team at NESTA. It is one of the ways NESTA is pioneering new approaches to stimulating innovation around the UK and building a body of evidence about how best to encourage and support innovation.



One of the biggest challenges of our generation is climate change. NESTA believe that encouraging people to work together will help find new ways - better ways - to tackle BIG problems, like reducing CO₂ emissions. NESTA want you to develop and implement new approaches that will lead towards a 60% reduction of CO₂ emissions in your communities. They believe that by encouraging you to work together - turning ideas into action by involving and engaging your community - you can potentially reduce CO₂ emissions on a bigger scale, more quickly and with more impact. The competition is only open to organisations or groups of people. These will need to be formally constituted as '[not-for-profit](#)', although newly formed groups can apply for this status later.

The prize is about encouraging change and innovation. NESTA are challenging you to reduce your CO₂ emissions in your community - which can be local, regional or more widely dispersed - by 60%. Are you up to the challenge? As this is an ambitious and difficult challenge NESTA are working with partners such as Unltd to offer advice and encouragement to participants. They will also offer practical support and some funding to finalists. The ten finalists, once selected, will have a year to demonstrate that they can turn their BIG ideas into action. The winner will be announced in late 2009. The first stage of applications needs to be returned by **29th February 2008**. - **PQASSO (Practical Quality Assurance System for Small Organisations)**

A quality assurance system designed for use within voluntary and community sector organisations. The system is self assessed, but with an opportunity to apply for an accredited Quality Mark.

- **Investors in People**

The Investors in People Standard helps organisations to improve performance and realise objectives through the effective management and development of its people.

- **Matrix**

The Matrix Standard is an outcome-based quality framework for the development of people, through effective delivery of information, advice and guidance.

- **Customer First**

The Framework focuses on the customer and the services they deliver and is divided into three sections, Customer Relationships, Market Awareness and People.

- **Investing in Volunteers**

Investing in Volunteers is the UK quality standard for organisations who involve volunteers. The Standard enables organisations to review their volunteer management, and demonstrates their commitment to volunteering.

- **ISO9000**

The recognised standard for the management of business processes. The core elements look at management responsibility, resources, product realisation, measurement, analysis and improvement.

Empowering rural communities

-Free workshop for people who support rural community groups-

The Regional Empowerment Partnership is part of the National Empowerment Partnership which has been established by the Department for Communities and Local Government. The central aim of the national strategy is to improve the quality and functioning of relationships between citizens and government in order to increase the ability of people to influence to decisions which affect their lives. The main purpose of the National Partnership is to improve community empowerment and engagement by showing where they are taking place, how well they are working, what makes them work well and disseminating and applying those lessons widely. This should bring about, over a period of time, an improvement in the quality of community empowerment across England.

The regional partnership will carry forward much of the practical work and the relationship with local authorities and their partners. The principal outcome being looked for is an increase in the number of people, especially people in disadvantaged areas, who participate in public issues, press for and contribute to the improvement of public services and help to shape the future of their locality. It is particularly important that the experiences of people working rurally are included in this exercise.

The Yorkshire and Humber Community Development Network, a member of the regional consortium, is organising a forum for rural community development workers to look at

gathering examples of good practice in empowerment and identifying gaps in strategy, provision and impact and looking at ways in which they might be filled.

This one day course examines Mark Friedman's Results Based Accountability (RBA) approach to strategic planning and delivery. It's based on three basic principles:

- Keeping accountability for populations separate from accountability for programmes or agencies
- Starting with the Ends (where we want to be), and working up to the Means (how we're going to get there)
- A seven stage step by step thinking process from talk to action

The principles of RBA in theory and practice and compatibility with other performance management and problem solving tools will be covered. Participants will leave with a model that can be used in partnerships and communities to devise solutions to multi-faceted problems and by managers who want to evaluate the services they provide.

This South Yorkshire Funding Advice Bureau (SYFAB) training course is for members of small to medium sized voluntary or community organisations in South Yorkshire who are involved in raising funds for the group. The course is accredited with the Open College Network. There is a £20 fee (non-refundable).

Course outline

Session 1: Introduction to fundraising - An overview of different sources of funding and the different ways these funds operate.

Session 2: Planning and preparation for fundraising - This session goes through the stages in developing a fundraising strategy or plan and the work you need to do before you can approach a funder.

Session 3: Sources of funding - How you select which funders will meet your needs best and how to go about approaching them?

Session 4: Applying for funding part 1 - What are funders looking for? How do you sell your group? This session introduces criteria, guidelines and application forms from funders and gives you the chance to start writing an application 'for real'.

Session 5: Applying for funding part 2 - This session continues the work on writing funding applications. You can get individual feedback on your funding application or funding strategy.

Session 6: Financial planning for fundraising - This session covers how to draw up a budget and cost a project for a funding application.

Session 7: Evaluation and Monitoring - Understanding what evaluation and monitoring are, how they relate to your group, and how you can make sure you meet funders' requirements.

Session 8: Portfolio Building/Evidence gathering - Support in putting portfolios together for accreditation. The session also includes a course review and information on further support and resources available.

This course will be running several times across South Yorkshire in spring and autumn. In spring, courses will run on Thursday mornings in Doncaster and Wednesday mornings in Sheffield. Feasibility study on establishing a Funding Advisers' National Network in England

A national partnership commissioned by the Finance Hub (www.financehub.org.uk) has produced a feasibility study on the establishment of a Funding Advice National Network (FANN) in England. The report examines the need for a FANN to support the work of funding advisers to the third sector and has detailed responses from over 250 advisers throughout the country. The study concludes that a FANN should be established. Key issues identified in taking this work further were:

- FANN should complement existing services rather than compete with them and prioritise working closely with existing funding advice agencies operating at regional and district level.
- FANN should be a sustainable, inclusive national organisation. It is likely to be funded through membership fees, income generated through service provision and grants.
- Membership of the FANN will need to reflect local and regional networks, individual agencies and organisations providing funding advice.

The aim is for the provision of funding advice to become an established profession within the sector, with high levels of recognition and confidence among service users. The Network would act as the disseminator and guardian of these standards.
