One to one support is provided to guide you step by step as you move towards employment.

- we have a peer support group for those on the programme, reducing isolation and providing a sense of belonging
- we have mentors that can support throughout this process
- we can provide opportunities to gain experience via volunteering (volunteering is not compulsory in order to join the programme)

The whole programme is person centred working with the individual at their pace. They choose what they want to access.

Intermediate Care Mapping Day


Tuesday 24th February

At the last meeting of the Intermediate Care Strategy it was agreed that services exist which contribute to the aims and outcomes of intermediate care /rehabilitation /reablement which are not currently recognised as part of intermediate care services. It was decided that a full day's meeting was needed in order to map all relevant services. This will help to inform the review of intermediate care services which is currently taking place.



Intermediate care is a short period (normally no longer than six weeks) of intensive rehabilitation and treatment or intensive care. The aim is to make sure that people who would otherwise be admitted to hospital, or who would need to be in hospital for a long period, are as independent as possible. Intermediate care may also reduce or delay the need for long-term residential or nursing care.

On the day the Adult Services Planning and Commissioning Team will map services across the health and social care community in Barnsley which contribute to the intermediate care agenda taking into account all adult client groups and a whole systems perspective.

We are looking for attendees from across adult health and social care services who can clarify in what ways their services link with, or contribute towards, the intermediate care/reablement agenda.

Update from our Advice Team

April 2009 will bring a number of changes to employment law.

For example,

- From 6th April 2009 the law for handling discipline, grievance and dismissal will change. The existing procedure will be repealed and will be replaced by a new Code of Practice which will make dealing with disputes in the workplace easier for employers.
- From 1 April 2009 the statutory annual leave entitlement is increased from 24 to 28 day (inclusive of bank holidays).
- There are also extensions to the right to request flexible working.

A comprehensive update on all the forthcoming changes will be provided in the next VAB Legal up Date, which will be available from 1st March 2009.

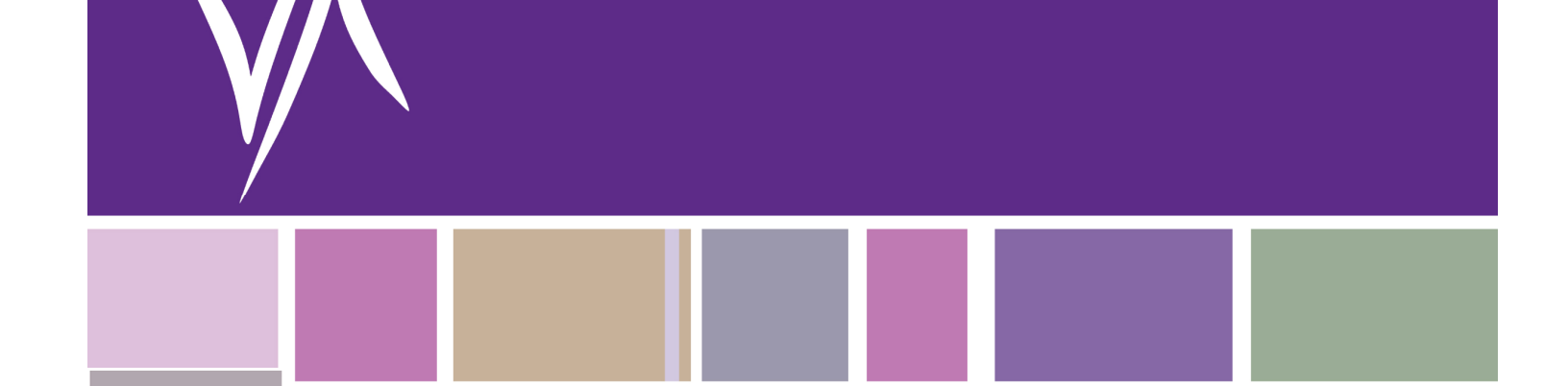

News from the Office of the Third Sector (OTS)

Recently Liam Byrne, Minister for the Cabinet Office, launched the Third Sector Action Plan 'Real Help for Communities: Volunteers, Charities and Social Enterprises.' The plan has been developed as a strategic response to help the sector emerge stronger from the current economic climate and, crucially, target help towards those that need it most. OTS is pleased to announce a number of measures, including:

- Up to £10 million investment in volunteer brokerage scheme for unemployed people with create over 40,000 opportunities for people to learn new skills and give back to communities through volunteering.
- A £15.5 million Community Resilience Fund will provide grant funding to small and medium providers in our most deprived communities. This is in addition to the £130 million already committed to the Grassroots Grants programme meaning more small grants to more community groups.
- A £16.5 million modernisation fund to help with the cost of mergers, partnerships and moves to more efficient sharing of back office functions for at least 3000 third sector organisations.
- A £0.5 million investment in the School for Social Entrepreneurs to double the number of people it trains to become social entrepreneurs, particularly those working in deprived communities.

A national campaign to raise awareness of the Government's commitment to pay all invoices within 10 days, which will improve cash flow for small organisations

Thanks to all of the organisations that took part in the extensive consultation during the development of this plan. Since November, we have had more than 100 written submissions to our website and many more discussions with the sector itself as to the challenges you were facing and how Government could support the sector. The launch of the plan represents



the first stage of an ongoing discussion with the sector on how Government can support them during these challenging economic times.
