A buffet will be provided from 4pm, followed by an informative/interactive event from 4.45pm to 7pm (please see the attached for more details).


The Gallery within the Civic will be displaying work by Twin Town Schwabish Gmünd artist Walter Giers.

## General News

### Third Sector Awards

### Legal Update – The Equality Bill

The Government has for some time been consulting on an Equality Bill has now been introduced into the House of Commons to start the legislative process. It covers many aspects of equality law but most significantly will affect;

**Recruitment:** if enacted, employers would be able to discriminate against otherwise equal candidates in favour of one with particular characteristics (of sex, race, disability etc.) where it is felt these people are currently under-represented in the workforce)

**Pay:** the Secretary of State will have the power to order private sector employers with more than 250 employees to publish information about differences in pay between men and women

**Pay:** pay secrecy clauses will be outlawed

**Disability:** for the first time the concept of indirect discrimination will apply to disabled people (indirect discrimination occurs when a provision supposedly applies equally to the whole workforce, but in fact has a disproportionate effect on a particular group (in this case, disabled people)

**Disability:** discrimination by association with a disabled person will be outlawed. This has come about due to the Coleman v Attridge case where the mother of a disabled son (who was not actually disabled herself) was successful in her claim of disability discrimination in the European Court of Justice.

**Harassment:** employers will be held liable for harassment by a third party (such as a client) if they have failed to act to prevent it. This is also in response to a recent case on this area

**Tribunals:** tribunals will be given the power to order changes in respect of a whole workforce, and not just in relation to the successful claimant

### Environmental Grants

**Voluntary or community groups that hold protecting the environment as one of their key aims could be eligible to apply for a cash boost from the South Yorkshire Community Foundation.**

Environmentally minded groups could be eligible for a grant of between £250 and £1,500 from the eaga community fund, administered by SYCF.

Through the eaga community fund, SYCF has £9,000 to give away to groups that address green issues at a grassroots level, by raising awareness and educating people on issues related to conserving the environment.

Eaga is one of the UK's leading providers of residential energy efficiency solutions and has a commitment to support green initiatives as well as helping to fund worthwhile local projects.

### Inspiring Communities offers £10m

Government cash for projects to help young people 'unlock talent' Community groups have been invited to form partnerships with local authorities and secondary schools to apply for a share of £10m from a new government fund designed to improve the life chances of disadvantaged young people.

Communities secretary Hazel Blears announced that 15 neighbourhood partnerships, which must involve at least one local third sector organisation, will receive grants of up to £450,000 each over the next two years as part of the [Inspiring Communities](#) initiative.

Areas that are given Inspiring Communities status will also be given advice on how to deliver locally conceived projects that encourage young people to "unlock their talent", the [Communities and Local Government](#) department said.

A community leader will be appointed in each neighbourhood to oversee the campaign.



"The communities where young people live should not hold them back; they should be the source of inspiration and practical support that will help them to achieve," said Blears. "This programme is about getting all the people in communities who want the very best for their children and for their area to work together to make the difference."

Inspiring Communities is a joint initiative between CLG, the [Department for Children, Schools and Families](#) and the [Cabinet Office](#).

The deadline for applications is 3 June, and the 15 successful neighbourhoods will be announced within 12 weeks of the closing date.

The ABC Awards are designed to help community, voluntary and statutory organisations undertake a project in partnership with South Yorkshire Police which addresses one of the Police Authority's Policing Priorities.

This year all applications must contribute towards **improving confidence and satisfaction with South Yorkshire Police** via **divisionary activities**.

Applicants can apply for **up to £2,000**.

### Nationwide Foundation offers £3.2m

Financial exclusion, housing and homelessness projects can apply

The [Nationwide Foundation](#) has launched a £3.2m grants programme for charities dealing with financial exclusion, housing issues and homelessness.

The fund will be split between a small grants programme and an investor programme.

The investor programme will offer three-year grants of up to £300,000 to charities with annual incomes of up to £10m. One-off grants of up to £5,000 for charities with incomes below £500,000 will be offered through the small grants programme.

Charities offering financial and housing support to victims of domestic abuse and to elderly people will be the fund's main beneficiaries.

Lisa Parker, chief executive of the foundation, said: "Without financial education, many people will not know how to survive the current harsh economic realities, so we are targeting charities that help the minority groups who are the most vulnerable and in need."

Applications for the investor programme must be made by 31 May, but the small grants programme has no deadline.
