## Growth and sustainability thrive in Barnsley's iconic new building

**Further to the last newsletter, on Monday 6th August, the Trustees of Voluntary Action Barnsley signed off the relevant contracts & paperwork, which means that the new centre for the third sector will become a reality. Building work has commenced and contractors have been on-site since 20th August.**

Dr Elizabeth Norris, Chair of VAB said: "The signing represents an important and momentous day which VAB has been striving towards for years. It has been an exercise in team working which has strengthened our experience of partnership with BMBC and other "funders".

The Centre is a long-awaited dream come true, not only for everyone connected to VAB, but Barnsley's Third Sector organisations in general. It will provide high-quality facilities in the town centre and encourage much needed networking and support opportunities as well as excellent office accommodation and facilities.

VAB has almost 900 Barnsley based voluntary and community groups on its database and recent research has shown that there are at least 4000 volunteers in Barnsley, a number growing every year. Groups and volunteers will be able to benefit from the centre and from the range of services that VAB provides: training, legal advice, payroll and accountancy services and help with the recruitment of volunteers.

We will be producing information packs to inform all interested parties of what the Building has to offer, and will continue to send updates to all who are currently on the mailing list. A series of meetings will be held to discuss the availability and allocation of accommodation spaces and prices. These meetings will take place over the next few months.

## Introduction - by Ian Ireland

Deputy Chief Executive, Voluntary Action Barnsley

**I'm writing this piece during the height of the holiday season, which explains why it's me rather than Penny, our Chief Executive. There was a time when summer was for catching up with odd items of work and unfinished business, but, rather like the lunch break, this is a thing of the past.**

We are now officially locked into the sequence of events leading to the completion of the new VAB building and the building contractors will be on site in late August. It is the task of all of us in VAB to continue the delivery of high quality services to our customers and to ensure that we do not become too obsessed with building related activities. Each part of the VAB product is continuously monitored so that we can live up to our quality commitments on a day to day basis.

All of us in the third sector have rather more uncertainty in our lives than we would ideally wish. Several significant funding streams come to an end before April 2008 and we are not altogether sure of the nature of future threats / opportunities.

The country's change of leadership seems to have brought with it a number of very positive declarations concerning the value of voluntary and community activity in performing real professional duties. There are indications that funding will reach third sector operators by less circuitous routes than hitherto and this is surely to be welcomed. If we are to undertake grown-up work we should be treated as adult professionals at every stage of the process.

## Auctioned books to benefit young people in Royston

An autobiography signed by Winston Churchill has been auctioned to raise money for young people in Royston.

"My Early Life" was given to an 11 year old Royston child, Philip Griffiths, by Churchill in 1941. He was also given an autograph book with the signatures of all the members of Churchill's war cabinet. In fact it made the Evening Standard News on July 5th 1941!

Later on the Griffiths family moved away from Barnsley but Philip's daughter, Jane, has asked that the proceeds from the auction go for the benefit of young people in Royston. YVA were chosen as the best organisation to carryout Jane's wishes.

Springboard 07 is a programme of motivational activities for young who are Not in Employment, Education or Training (NEET). The Young Volunteers Agency, Millennium Volunteers and Connexions are working together to help to motivate a group of young people to move on. The Activities have been around, 'Sight & Sound' looking at Arts as a vehicle for motivation and have included workshops in: Drumming, Art (self portraits), DJing & Mixing. We have also conducted a range of 'out and about' activities including: Climbing & Abseiling, Kayaking & Rafting, and Traversing.

Everyone involved in this programme has had a great time and just as importantly they are ready to move forward. Some of them have enrolled to volunteer overseas and help support groups of people who are less fortunate than themselves.

The partners would like to thank ITS (Independent Training Services) and the Barnsley NEET Strategy Group for their financial support of the programme.

Connexions is an Information, Advice and Guidance Service for young people. Voluntary Action Barnsley & Priory Campus currently work with two Voluntary Sector Personal Advisors and youth workers from The Young Volunteers Agency who offer young people advice on a range of different issues. As part of our service we also provide young people information around sexual health and operate a 'c-card' scheme.

# Government Third Sector Review

**The Government launched a review of the future role of the Third Sector in social and economic regeneration (the 'Third Sector Review') as part of the Comprehensive Spending Review process.**

The review will inform government spending between 2008 and 2011 and set a strategy for government support for the Third Sector for the decade following 2008. The report is over 100 pages so we have tried to condense the main points.

The report focuses on four key areas:

- **Enabling voice and campaigning;**
- **Strengthening communities;**
- **Transforming public services, and;**
- **Encouraging social enterprise.**

## Enabling voice and campaigning

The report recognises the role of the sector in giving voice to communities and empowering people to campaign for change. The response to the report consultation emphasised the importance of ensuring a diversity of voices are heard in consultations and the role of government in enabling an environment for organisations to provide voice to citizens and to campaign.

## Strengthening communities

The report emphasises the vital contribution community-based organisations make to civil renewal and neighbourhood regeneration, and to building democratic engagement and social capital. The review acknowledges that there are inconsistencies in partnership working at a local level, and notes that the Office of the Third Sector (OTS) and Department of Communities and Local Government (CLG) are examining principles of representation to ensure that the third sector is properly represented on Local Strategic Partnerships and in the performance management framework for local authorities.

## Small grants

The report recognises the importance of small grants at a local level, confirming that the £80m community organisations fund announced in Budget 2007 will be distributed via local partners including community foundations. In addition, £50m will be made available to local independent organisations to invest in local endowment funds. This will act as a catalyst to attract other sources of funding. CLG are currently consulting on how to support community anchor organisations, and OTS will support this work with £10m funding between April 2008-2011.

## Volunteering

The review reiterates the importance of volunteers to strengthening communities, civil society and supporting others. To continue support for a culture of volunteering, government will invest £117m funding in V, the youth volunteering organisation, to build awareness of volunteering among young people and create a new National Youth Volunteering Programme. Government will also continue to offer match funding for donations from private businesses to support youth volunteering.

## Transforming public services

The report recognises that earlier government reviews have focused on the role of the sector in service delivery, but now reiterates a commitment to the multiple roles the sector can play in transforming public services: in delivery; as a partner in innovation; as a partner in the design of services and as campaigner for change in the way services are delivered. A number of measures were announced in the December 2006 public services action plan and the review further commits to including advice on working with the third sector in a modernised version of government accounting rules.

## Encouraging social enterprise

The report recognises the contribution of social enterprise and the benefit of promoting enterprising solutions within the wider third sector in supporting sustainability. This includes the appointment of seven new social enterprise strategic partners for the OTS in June 2007: Social Enterprise Coalition; the School for Social Entrepreneurs (with UnLtd); Plunkett Foundation; Social Firms UK; Co-operatives UK; Prowess; and a national Olympics social enterprise partnership.

A number of measures were announced in the recent Social Enterprise Action Plan, which seeks to embed social enterprise in government policy development. The report confirms that government will now consult the social enterprise sector on the proposed social enterprise Ambassadors programme, strategic funding and the Make Your Mark campaign which seeks to encourage a more enterprising culture amongst young people.

Social enterprise education will become part of the main key stage 3 and 4 curriculum framework from 2008, and the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority is consulting on how best to include social enterprise in the GCSE Business Studies syllabus.

## Funding through the Safer and Stronger Communities Fund

Following the announcement in the interim report of the third sector review, one project being funded through the Safer and Stronger Communities Fund is happening in the Bank End area of Barnsley. Voluntary Action Barnsley (the local Council for Voluntary Service) has joined forces with Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council's community planning team to bring a neighbourhood management approach to the area.

£65,000 has been made available through the neighbourhood element of the Safer and Stronger Communities Fund and has been allocated to carry out intense community engagement; provide activities which will generate positive community spirit, work with residents and support them to lead and influence issues that affect their quality of life. Links with other local governance structures, such as the Area Board, will also be strengthened. In this way Barnsley Council is promoting community engagement and service delivery at a local level, by bringing together the third sector, service providers and the relatively small amount of funding needed for the project. **Third Sector Review - page 33**

### Case Study

#### DLA Piper LLP and The Danum Project

#### Sheffield lawyers makeover Doncaster church project

Dilapidated rooms belonging to a Doncaster church were transformed for community use by a team of handy lawyers from DLA Piper. The makeover to the 17th century St George's house, one of the oldest buildings in Doncaster, formed part of the plans to regenerate the area and revitalise run down rooms and facilities for community use through a £6m fundraising challenge to restore the Minister and the surrounding area.

Around 16 staff from DLA Piper's Sheffield office picked up paint brushes, dug out dustsheets and grabbed gardening equipment to give a facelift to facilities at the Danum Project that works in partnership with the Minister Church of St George Doncaster. They painted the office and undertook clearance work in the garden, looping hedgerows and weeding.

Beci Hitchen in DLA Piper's Sheffield office Insurance Group, who acted as team leader for the challenge said: "The idea of the scheme is that our company gets to put something back into the local community that will benefit everyone. We worked really hard all day but had great fun and there was a great team spirit. The decorating and gardening work we undertook will help improve the look of the building inside and out. Hopefully this will be the first of many challenges completed by the team."

Jane Hinds, appeal and project development director at the Danum Project Ltd said: "Everyone got really stuck in, had a lot of fun and didn't mind getting their hands dirty. No matter what industry our volunteers come from we find they all have a fantastic laugh, find out all about the voluntary sector and above all work very hard."

Neil Thompson, CSR Partner for the Sheffield office, said: "This team building challenge not only brings benefit to the community but our employees as well. Volunteering projects like these build team spirit and provide an opportunity to test project management and leadership skills."

## Community Workshop Project

**John Niland and three others started the 'Community Workshop Project' over three years ago with the aim of developing the craft skills of local people and creating enterprise opportunities.**

The workshop was a place where people could meet, be trained in specialist wood crafts, have the use of specialist equipment and the space in which to work.

Access to training, tools, machinery and workshop materials made all the difference.



The man went on to develop his new hobby and with new confidence eventually refurbished his daughter's house

### How long have you worked or volunteered for VAB?

I started working for VAB in April 2006. I volunteer as a Breastfeeding Peer Supporter in Barnsley Hospital offering support and information on a weekly basis (where possible). I also offer Breastfeeding Peer Support over the telephone on behalf of the Yummy Mummy Breastfeeding Peer Support Group in Darfield.

### How many hours do you volunteer or work for us?

I am employed 22.5 hours a week as a Breastfeeding Link Worker Supervisor, I volunteer between 1 – 2 hours a week at the Hospital and always have the Peer Support telephone switched on (just in case).

### What does your job involve?

We as a project have a vision which is 'To support communities in Barnsley to understand and embrace the importance of breastfeeding'. I manage the day to day running of the project and delegate tasks

to the team. We as a team promote and support the Barnsley's network of Peer Support Groups in many ways. We are part of Barnsley's Breastfeeding Team and are aiding the implementation of Unicef UK, Baby Friendly by providing Policy Workshops on the 'Joint Barnsley Borough Breastfeeding Policy'. We also offer organisations Breastfeeding Friendly Awards and provide training. We provide Breastfeeding Antenatal Sessions and offer Infant Feeding information by linking with the Baby Doll Programme which is aimed at 15 to 16 year olds.

### What is the best thing about working or volunteering for VAB?

I enjoy working for VAB because I feel part of a team, everybody matters.

### If you won a million pounds tomorrow, what would you do with it?

It won't happen, so it's not a problem!!!!!!

### What do think would make a difference in making barnsley a better place to live?

I would like Breastfeeding to be accepted as the normal way to feed and mother a child, thus eventually making a healthier town.

### Tell us a bit about your background before you came to barnsley and how that has shaped how you view the world
