The People's Millions 2009

The People's Millions, Big Lottery Fund's programme that allows the public to decide where Lottery funding should go, launched earlier this month.

Organisations are able to apply for up to £50,000 for projects that will improve the quality of life of local communities through transforming the local environment, or provide opportunities or facilities for enjoying the local environment.

Eight short listed regional projects will go head to head for the public vote on ITV's Calendar programme in November and the five projects with the most votes will be awarded a grant.




Format

EXCITING times lie ahead for the South Yorkshire Community Foundation after its move to a new state of the art office space.

The forward thinking charitable organisation is the latest to move to the G1 building, part of the Gateway Business Centre developments in the east end of Sheffield, and made the switch official on March 2.

The area has undergone something of a transformation in recent years, and SYCF are looking to become part of its rise to prominence.

Pauline Grice, chief executive of SYCF, said: "We are absolutely delighted to have made this move, into what is one of the most exciting business space developments in Sheffield.

"We are taking great strides as an organisation, and are looking forward to pushing on in our new premises."

SYCF's new home on Leeds Road in Attercliffe, just next to Don Valley Stadium, comprises two large office spaces, two substantial meeting rooms as well as disabled access into the building.

The full address for SYCF from March 2 onwards will be **Unit 3 – G1 Building, 6 Leeds Road, Sheffield, S9 3TY.**




New Compact in November

Sir Bert Massie, Commissioner for the Compact, recently received a letter from Kevin Brennan, minister for the third sector, and Simon Blake, chair of Compact Voice, asking him to lead the process to redraft the document.

The Compact has not been revised since former Prime Minister Tony Blair established it in 1998 to outline how the voluntary and public sectors should behave towards each other.

The letter asks Massie to take "what is best from the existing documents rather than start from scratch and ensure that the new version takes into account recent developments in law, policy and practice".



The Office of the Third Sector and Compact Voice are establishing a cross-sector advisory panel to oversee the issues the new version should cover. Commissioning is expected to feature prominently.

The panel's recommendations will go out to consultation in the summer before the new document is launched during November's Compact Week.

Revising the Compact was one of Massie's main recommendations after last year's national debate on the future of the Compact. But there is still no news of any developments on his other main recommendation - putting the commission on a statutory footing.

Richard Corden, chief executive of the commission, said he was relaxed about the timeframe. "The refresh is more important and the one that can proceed without parliamentary time," he said.


The Regional Community Panel is looking for new members

The Community Panel brings community voices to the heart of the regional empowerment programme.

The Community Panel comprises people who are active at neighbourhood / community level around the issues of local and community voice and democracy. Some may be paid workers, but most will be residents who are active in an unpaid capacity. The Panel draws on this knowledge, skills and experience in order to improve community empowerment and engagement across the region.

Members of the Panel will already be active in their community and will bring direct experience of how policies on community empowerment and engagement work on the ground. They will contribute community perceptions of what works and what are the barriers, lodging issues and starting the development of a community auditing mechanism.

G20 London Summit is being held on 2nd April 2009

This Summit represents a real opportunity for the Third Sector to influence the global debate on economic recovery and social change. Some background to the Summit is below.

Background

- The private summit of G20 Leaders will involve a number of meetings including a working lunch. The Summit will be followed by a briefing for the press.
- **The goal for the London Summit** is for Leaders to agree to immediate action to support the global economy, safeguard jobs and protect the poorest, plus reform to the international financial system to prevent future crises. This will amount to a *Global New Deal* that will secure recovery and long term stability and growth.
- All those countries that were present in Washington have been invited: the leaders of G20 countries, Spain, the Netherlands and the European Commission.
- Additional representatives from Africa (Ethiopia's President Meles as Chair of NEPAD) and Asia (Thailand's Prime Minister Abhisit as Chair of ASEAN).
- The Heads of key international institutions including the UN, World Bank and IMF will also be invited to contribute to relevant parts of the agenda.



WriteToThem is the only website in the UK you can use to contact any of your elected representatives. Enter a postcode and it'll tell you who all your local representatives are, and a bit about who you should contact for which reasons.
