Building Update

The Trustees of Voluntary Action Barnsley signed off the relevant contracts & paperwork, which means that the new Building will become a reality. Building work commenced and Contractors have been on-site since 20th August.

Dr Elizabeth Norris, Chair of VAB said: ***"The signing represents an important and momentous day which VAB has been striving towards for years. It has been an exercise in team working which has strengthened our experience of partnership working with BMBC and other "funders".***

The Centre is a long-awaited dream come true, not only for everyone connected to VAB, but Barnsley's Third Sector organisations in general. It will provide high-quality facilities in the town centre and encourage much needed networking and support opportunities as well as excellent office accommodation and facilities.

VAB has almost 900 Barnsley based voluntary and community groups on its database and recent research has shown that there are at least 4000 volunteers in Barnsley, a number growing every year. Groups and volunteers will be able to benefit from the centre and from the range of services that VAB provides: training, legal advice, payroll and accountancy services and help with the recruitment of volunteers.

We will be producing information packs to inform all interested parties of what the Building has to offer, and will continue to send updates to all who are currently on the mailing list. A series of meetings will be held to discuss the availability and allocation of accommodation spaces and prices. These meetings will take place over the next few months.

The new centre is on schedule for completion in 2008, until then VAB will remain at their offices on Queens Rd. If you would like to find out more or attend meetings, please contact Angela Jones on 01226 242726.

Student placements required at not-for-profit organisations

The University of Derby has begun a programme to encourage its management students to take placements at charities and gain practical experience. The award for employability, leadership and management – an unaccredited programme endorsed by the Institute of Leadership and Management – requires students to complete a 70-hour project that includes "elements of leadership and management" and forms part of their assessment.

Placements would include projects such as installing databases or designing websites. The university is appealing for not-for-profit organisations to take part in the scheme. About 45 students are expected to be included in the first intake when the award is launched next month.

"We're asking organisations to offer a student a project – such as designing a website – that teases out elements of leadership and management," a spokeswoman for the award said. "Charities might need a database installing but not have the administrative support or skills. They might also spot graduates they want to employ."

Benevolence Today Campaign

A coalition of benevolence charities launched a campaign on the 22nd August to get more voluntary organisations to refer people in need to its members. The Benevolence Today campaign is made up of 31 partners, which between them helped 26,000 people in 2006. The coalition has the funds to help many more, ranging from architects to timber workers.

The coalition intends to contact large umbrella bodies and hundreds of other charities to identify those who could benefit from its services and financial assistance, but are unaware that they qualify for help. The aim of the campaign is to build referral partnerships with other service-delivery and advice-giving charities.

"Most of our partners have an occupational link in the criteria for who qualifies for their help, so we will require other charities to ask their customers for their current or past occupations," said Susanne Kendler, head of development at Benevolence Today.

"Those in need often feel they go from one cul-de-sac to another. We want to improve that situation by starting a discussion about how service-deliverers can refer customers to others who can help."

Free Expert Patient course for those living with long term health conditions

25th October at LIFT building Worsbrough, Barnsley

The Expert Patients Programme (EPP) is a free course for anyone living with a long-term health condition. E.g. arthritis, diabetes, heart disease, MS, etc. The course aims to help people take more control by increasing understanding of their conditions and teaching new skills to manage their conditions better on a daily basis - leading to improved quality of life.

The Expert Patients Programme (EPP) is a NHS-based training programme led by people who, themselves, live with a long-term health condition. The course is run over six consecutive weekly sessions of 2.5 hours each week. Each week, two volunteer tutors lead 8-16 participants through structured course material delivered from a scripted manual covering topics such as relaxation, diet, exercise, fatigue, breaking the symptom cycle, managing pain and medication, and communication with health care professionals. The EPP course is based upon the Chronic Disease Self-Management Program (CDSMP).

Funding

Funding for creative projects across South Yorkshire

Seven voluntary and community projects from South Yorkshire were delighted to receive a combined total of £131,000 worth of funding from the Creative Exchange: South Yorkshire (CE: SY) programme last week.

The projects, based in areas of Sheffield, Rotherham, Doncaster and Barnsley have each received Innovation Fund grants to cover activities such as feasibility studies and business planning to enable them to purchase and renovate community buildings, which will be turned into enterprise centres for new creative and digital businesses. Tracey Johnson from Creative Barnsley received a cheque towards the renovation of part of Elsecar Heritage Centre into the CB Hive - a hub of creative workspace and activity.

The CE: SY programme, funded by Yorkshire Forward and Objective One and to a lesser extent by Sheffield Investment Bond and supported by the Arts Council and BBC Sheffield, is a strategic economic initiative working in partnership with communities and the creative and digital industries to facilitate the development of the creative industries infrastructure and enterprise/employment opportunities in key priority neighbourhoods and communities of interest groups across South Yorkshire.
